To provide leadership and guidance to a dynamic team of professionals who bring their talent and creativity to crafting an engaging listening experience advocating and promoting CKUA's diverse communities through an eclectic music mix and related arts coverage.

Working in an ever-evolving media landscape, you will contribute to the evolution of established radio practices along with the convergence and emergence of countless digital platforms, recognizing that CKUA's content creation is applicable beyond traditional radio programming. The Senior Producer collaborates across CKUA, contributing to the planning, developing, organizing, producing, scheduling of content for CKUA platforms, creating opportunities for creativity and originality.

Your responsibilities include:

- Developing and monitoring evaluation criteria to assess the effectiveness of broadcast and digital content, ensuring the CKUA brand is consistently presented and intended outcomes achieved.
- The planning, coordination, and oversight of live and recorded performances in all CKUA studios, performances spaces and at live-on-location remote broadcasts
- The planning, organizing, production and supervision of audio for a wide range of music programming (live and/or recorded) interviews (short and long-form) conducted with a firm knowledge of sound journalistic and music presentation practices and integrity
- Recent relevant first-hand experience or thorough knowledge about broadcast and/or podcast hosting, to facilitate mentoring and training your colleagues to develop and maintain best practices as hosts and producers
- Active involvement in identifying, recruiting, and developing new voice and content creation talent.
- Take a leading role in the professional development of current hosts and content creation talent
- Coordinating video capture of music performance (both in-studio and remote locations), and special events (including fundraiser specials and live event broadcasts)
- Contribute to the development and ongoing management of the department budget and administrative practices.
- Working with our Community Relations team to maximize our collective ability to market and promote our broadcast and digital content and work with external partners (including sponsors, advertisers, and community partners) to fulfill their expectations
- Performing administrative duties, such as approving timesheets, approving leaves, organizing individual and group meetings, executing air checks, and planning special events
- Develop authentic content and strategies to strengthen and elevate CKUA's connection with existing listeners while creating new audience relationships which bolster and enhance the CKUA brand.

Collaborating with the Content Director, department colleagues, and cross-department colleagues, the Senior Producer takes a holistic approach to the planning, delivery, and administrative responsibilities necessary to support the presentation of multi-platform programming. Your leadership ensures the consistency required to promote the CKUA brand and mission as a predominantly listener-supported, community-centric entity.

In the spirit of our journey to promote reconciliation, we honour the truth of the shared history and acknowledge that we operate on Treaty 6 and Treaty 7 territories.

Treaty 6 territory is the traditional gathering place for diverse Indigenous peoples, including the Cree, Blackfoot, Metis, Nakoda, Sioux, Iroquois, Dene, Ojibway, Saulteaux/Anishinaabe and many others whose histories, languages and cultures continue to influence our vibrant community of Amiskwaciwaskahigan also known as Edmonton.

Treaty 7 is the traditional lands of the Blackfoot Confederacy which includes the Siksika, Kainai and Pikani, the Tsuut'ina and the Stoney Nakoda nations, including the Chiniki,



Bearspaw and Wesley nations. We also recognize the Metis people and the Inuit who make their home here in Mohkings'tsis, also known as Calgary.
