To provide exceptional relationship building skill and fund development expertise to cultivate and grow a mid-level giving program to support CKUA's mission to build and connect a global community of music, arts, and culture enthusiasts through in-person, broadcast, and online programming.

Working in an ever-evolving arts and culture environment and media landscape, you will be given a robust portfolio of loyal donors and will drive the development, tactical implementation and growth strategy for mid-level giving and an associated Leadership Circle membership program. In this role you collaborate across CKUA, contributing to the planning, developing, organizing and delivery of multi-channel fundraising campaigns, special events and other donor engagement and stewardship activities to produce ongoing and impactful results for both revenue generation and audience development.

Your responsibilities will include:

Mid-Level Giving Development

- As part of the organizational development plan, develop and execute a cultivation, retention, acquisition/growth and stewardship plan for the mid-level giving portfolio of donors contributing \$1,000 to \$5,000 annually to optimize giving for mid-level and major giving.
- Research and assess giving levels for mid-level giving development.
- Ensure donor cultivation and stewardship activities and giving benefits provide a deeper connection to CKUA's programming and mission.
- Achieving targets for prospecting, donor engagements and revenue generation for mid-level giving set by the Development Manager and Director, Community Relations.
- Provide regular standard reporting assigned by the Development Manager.
- Drive mid-level fundraising campaign strategy and revenue generation for CKUA's bi-annual pledge drives.
- Support the CEO, Board Revenue Development Committee and Director, Community Relations with donor prospecting and qualifying for major gifts development as required.
- Work alongside the Fund Development and wider Community Relations teams.

CKUA is a donor-supported arts organization that envisions a better world connected through music, arts and culture, and remains steadfast in a mission to build and connect a global community of music, arts, and culture enthusiasts through in-person, broadcast, and online programming.

In the spirit of our journey to promote reconciliation, we honour the truth of the shared history and acknowledge that we operate on Treaty 6, Treaty 7 and Treaty 8 territories.

Treaty 6 territory is the traditional gathering place for diverse Indigenous peoples, including the Cree, Blackfoot, Metis, Nakoda, Sioux, Iroquois, Dene, Ojibway, Saulteaux/Anishinaabe and many others whose histories, languages and cultures continue to influence our vibrant community of Amiskwaciwaskahigan also known as Edmonton.

Treaty 7 is the traditional lands of the Blackfoot Confederacy which includes the Siksika, Kainai and Pikani, the Tsuut'ina and the Stoney Nakoda nations, including the Chiniki, Bearspaw and Wesley nations. We also recognize the Metis people and the Inuit who make their home here in Mohk'ins'tsis, also known as Calgary.

Treaty 8 is the traditional lands and home to the Cree, Dene, Metis, and Inuit whose footsteps have tread these lands for generations in northern Alberta and around Fort McMurray or Nistawayaw "The Merging of 3 Rivers" in Cree. The Treaty Lands were and are a promise between nations to share the land and support one another. We are all Treaty people!
