Broadcast Technician

Under the guidance of the Director Information and Broadcast Technology, the **Broadcast Technician** is responsible for the maintenance and repair of all equipment associated with daily operation of our company. The Broadcast Technician, along with our IT staff, get our diverse and eclectic programming out to the ears of our community.

Your key areas of responsibility will include:

Installation, maintenance, and repairs on equipment (both digital and mechanical) associated with:

- Broadcast system –
 - 16 transmitters across Alberta
 - Remote productions facilities at offsite locations – festivals, remote hosts
 - Setting broadcast equipment for fundraising activities
 - Preventative maintenance and repairs
- Production and On-Air Studios in both Edmonton and Calgary
 - Repairs, maintains, and provides technical support and guidance on control rooms, audio processing, digital edit suites and other equipment.
 - Be the primary point of contact for tech on call.
- In office equipment
 - Repairs and maintains all office equipment in cooperation with IT staff.
 - Assists with office moves, as required.
- Administration
 - Prepares and maintains various technical broadcast records and logs required by regulation and for CKUA internal use.
 - Remains up to date on industry trends to ensure all practices are current, align with CKUA's licenses and manufacturers requirements.

- Buildings
 - Functions as building onsite and works with the property manager systems to ensure AB Hotel building is in good working order.
 - Maintains and monitors the Security System for the building.
 - Maintains buildings where needed at transmitter sites.

Desired Knowledge/Education/Experience:

- Post-secondary school graduation from a recognized technical institute in broadcast electronic technology and designation or eligible for designation as a CET.
- Clear Class 5 driver's license.
- 5 years' experience in a similar or related position

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is expected to demonstrate the following competencies and behaviors in order to successfully meet the requirements of the position and to support the goals and objectives of CKUA Radio:

- A solid working knowledge/understanding of OMT automation and On-Air play out systems in a networked environment.

Ability to demonstrate conduct appropriate to the occasion, when representing CKUA on a formal or informal basis.
- Effective interpersonal skills in dealing with internal contacts.
- Exercises creativity and innovation in the resolution of problems
- Ability to deal with stressful situations and deadlines.
- Physical dexterity required in the maintenance of electronic equipment.
- Continuing personal education and development in broadcast technologies.
- Knowledge safety and an understanding of the regulatory environment (CRTC, Safety Code 6) CKUA operates within, in order to assist with regulatory filings when required.

In the spirit of our journey to promote reconciliation, we honour the truth of the shared history and acknowledge that we work on Treaty 6, Treaty 7, and Treaty 8 territories.

Treaty 6 territory is the traditional gathering place for diverse Indigenous peoples, including the Cree, Blackfoot, Metis, Nakoda, Sioux, Iroquois, Dene, Ojibway, Saulteaux/Anishinaabe and many others whose histories, languages and cultures continue to influence our vibrant community of Amiskwaciwaskahigan also known as Edmonton.

Treaty 7 is the traditional lands of the Blackfoot Confederacy which includes the Siksika, Kainai and Pikani, the Tsuut'ina and the Stoney Nakoda nations, including the Chiniki, Bearspaw and Wesley nations. We also recognize the Metis people and the Inuit who make their home here in Mohkings'tsis, also known as Calgary.

Treaty 8 is the traditional lands and home to the Cree, Dene, Metis, and Inuit whose footsteps have tread these lands for generations in northern Alberta and around Fort McMurray or Nistawayaw "The Merging of 3 Rivers" in Cree.

The Treaty Lands were and are a promise between nations to share the land and support one another. We are all Treaty people!
